Myanmar Flood Relief



In mid-September, Typhoon Yagi swept through Southeast Asia wreaking havoc in several countries. Particularly hard hit was Myanmar, already suffering from a long-standing civil war and oppression by a brutal military regime. Buddhist Relief Mission's appeal for aid raised more than \$3000, which was immediately transferred to the monks in Sri Lanka coordinating relief efforts. Here is their report.

October 7, 2024

The relief efforts are ongoing, and our team is distributing essential supplies to several flooded areas. Yesterday, the team visited Inle Lake in Shan State, and tomorrow they will proceed to another state.

The situation in Myanmar remains unpredictable. The military is forcing flood victims to return to their homes for a census, but many people have lost their homes entirely. Some have lost family members, while others have lost their farm animals, essential for livelihood and survival. In such a dire situation, the military is providing little to no assistance and is solely focused on the upcoming election.

The recovery process for the people affected by the flooding will take many months. Therefore, it is crucial to continue our relief work.

Your compassion and generous support have significantly improved the lives of many families. For this, we extend our deepest gratitude to you and all the donors who have contributed to this meritorious project.

Your efforts are deeply appreciated.
